There are tens of thousands of Georgians with disabilities who want to work in a regular job with everyone else. CRPs have been trailblazers in the field of employment services. They have developed and financed programs across Georgia.

The majority of people using Medicaid are people with disabilities and working is nearly impossible without supports and the ability to maintain insurance.
